Allegheny Township owns the rail trail south of the Freeport Bridge. The land initially belonged to Mr. Treadway. He donated some and sold some.

River Forest partners quick claimed north of the Freeport Bridge. Some of the rail bed has gone to litigation. Allegheny Township had to pay 2 landowners for the easement. River Forest was never challenged because of the location of the rail bed at the base of a steep hillside..

River Forest group wants to develop and needs access across the rail bed. Allegh Kiski is giving grief about the crossing.

River Forest wants to put a water treatment plant south of the Freeport Bridge and the landowners are fighting it. They can not continue with some sections of development without this treatment plant. Last meeting between Allegh Kiski, River Partners and the DCNS was in February 2006. AKRC requested a grant extension and got it. Grant is for \$100k to AKRC

Homer Tomer from River Forest is willing to deed the land to AKRC with an easement to 38 acres between the trail and the river. AKRC said no access – Rail Trail people said no problem.
